BANK HOLIDAY.

His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor has issued a Proclamation (under the Bankers' Act, 1872), a copy of which is appended, appointing, with the approval of His Majesty the King, Thursday, the 1st June, 1922, to be observed as a Bank Holiday in the Island for the Celebration of His Majesty's Birthday, in place of Saturday, the 3rd June, 1922.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by Section 5 of the Bankers' Act, 1872, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor by Proclamation from time to time, when it is made to appear to the Governor in any special case, that in any year it is inexpedient that a day by the said Act appointed for a Bank Holiday should be a Bank Holiday, to declare that such day shall not in such year be a Bank Holiday, and to appoint such other day as to the Governor may seem fit to be a Bank Holiday instead of such day, and thereupon the day so appointed by the Governor shall in such year be substituted for the day so appointed by the said Act.

AND WHEREAS the birthday of the Reigning Sovereign is appointed to be observed as a Bank Holiday in this Isle.

AND WHEREAS the birthday of the Reigning Sovereign in the present year falls on the Saturday immediately preceding Whit Monday, and it is considered that the observation of such day as a Bank Holiday will cause inconvenience to the trade of this Isle.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by virtue of the power and authority in me vested as aforesaid, do hereby declare that the 3rd day of June, 1922, shall not be a Bank Holiday, and I hereby appoint the 1st day of June, 1922, to be observed as a Bank Holiday throughout this Isle in place of such 3rd day of June, 1922.
