Rules for the Employment of Aliens.

His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor has, under the provisions of Section 3 of the Aliens Restriction Amendment Act, 1930, made an Order, dated the twentieth day of October, 1930, a copy of which is appended, containing rules regulating the employment of aliens.

The rules were approved by Tynwald on the 31st day of October, 1930.

Employment of Aliens.

The Aliens Restriction Acts, 1922 to 1930.

Rules under Section 3 of the Aliens Restriction Amendment Act, 1930.

I, the said Lieutenant Governor of the Isle of Man in pursuance of the powers in me vested under section 3 of the Aliens Restriction Amendment Act, 1930, do hereby make the following rules:—

1. For the purpose of these rules, "an alien" means an alien who has entered the Isle of Man after the 1st day of November, 1930.
2. Before taking an alien into employment the proposed employer shall make application in writing to the Government Secretary, Government Office, in the form set out in the schedule to these rules and shall supply the particulars specified in such form.
3. If in the opinion of the Governor it is not desirable that such alien should be so employed on the ground of the antecedents or character of the alien, or that there are sufficient British subjects of competent skill available to undertake such employment, or on any other sufficient ground which in the opinion of the Governor would warrant the withholding of approval, he may within seven days after receipt of the application in Government Office direct notice to be given to the proposed employer that the application has been refused.
4. Any person employing an alien without making application as prescribed by these rules, or after having received notice within seven days after receipt of his application in Government Office that such application has been refused, shall be liable on summary conviction at the suit of the Chief Constable or any officer of police to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds, with a further penalty not exceeding one pound a day during which such alien is so employed.
5. These rules may be cited as the Aliens Restriction (Employment) Rules, 1930.
