PSITTACOSIS.

Parrots (Prohibition of Import) Regulations, 1930.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE LIEUTENANT-GOVERNOR has issued a Proclamation (a copy of which is appended), under the Local Government (Consolidation) Act, 1916, embodying certain Regulations made by the Local Government Board, amending the Regulations, dated the 23rd May, 1930, made by the Board with a view to preventing, mitigating, and guarding against the spreading of Psittacosis.

Any person who wilfully violates any of the said Regulations is liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty Pounds.

A PROCLAMATION.

The Local Government Board for the Isle of Man having made regulations in the following terms:—

The Local Government Board in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by Section 195 of the Local Government (Consolidation) Act, 1916, and of all other powers it enabling hereby makes the following regulations, that is to say:—

The Regulations made by the Board on the 23rd day of May, 1930, prohibiting the importation of Parrots into this Isle shall not apply to Parrots imported from England, Scotland, Wales, or Ireland.

This 11th day of July, 1930.

I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by virtue of the powers and authority in me vested, do hereby order and direct that due observance of the said Regulations be had throughout this Isle.
