**THE SEA GULL PRESERVATION
AMENDMENT ACT, 1930.**

His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor has approved the following procedure regarding the issue of licences under the Sea Gull Preservation Amendment Act, 1930, for the taking of the eggs of the herring gull.

- (1) Persons desiring to be licensed must apply to the nearest Police Station.
- (2) Applications will be forwarded to Government Office by the Chief Constable.
- (3) Applicants after approval by the Fisheries Board will receive licences from Government Office, subject to the following conditions:—
 - (a) The licences will be valid and effective only from the 1st April to the 30th June, both dates inclusive, in any year, and will be confined to a definite locality.
 - (b) The licence will be for the sole use of the licensee.
 - (c) Fresh eggs only shall be taken and shall be used for the purposes of food.
 - (d) The licensee shall report each Monday to the nearest Police Station the number of eggs taken by him during the preceding week.
 - (e) The licence may be revoked and cancelled at any time.
- (4) The Chief Constable will report to Government Office weekly the total number of eggs which have been collected under the licences.
