The Cattle Diseases Prevention Act, 1929.

The Tuberculosis (Amendment) Order, 1931.

His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor has issued an Order, dated the 23rd February, 1931 (a copy of which is appended), under the Cattle Diseases Prevention Act, 1929, amending "The Tuberculosis Order, 1929," as printed in Government Circular No. 1250.

The amendments provide for

- (1) an increase in the minimum amount of compensation payable to the owner of a bovine animal compulsorily slaughtered under the provisions of the Tuberculosis Order, 1929; and
- (2) the market value of a bovine animal before compulsory slaughter to be determined by agreement between the Government Secretary, or person authorised by the Government Secretary, and the owner of the animal, and, in the event of disagreement, by arbitration.

The Tuberculosis (Amendment) Order, 1931.

BY VIRTUE of the power and authority in me in that behalf vested by the Cattle Diseases Prevention Act, 1929, I, the said Lieutenant Governor, do hereby order as follows:—

1. Article 7 (1) of the Tuberculosis Order, 1929, is hereby revoked and the following Article substituted:—

“ 7. (1) The market value of an animal shall before slaughter be determined for the purposes of this Order by agreement between the Government Secretary, or person authorised by the Government Secretary, and the owner of the animal, or if they shall fail so to agree, by two arbitrators, one to be chosen by the Lieutenant Governor and one by the owner, and an umpire to be chosen by such arbitrators, and the value of the animal as fixed by such arbitration shall be communicated in writing to the Government Secretary.”

2. In Article 9 of the Tuberculosis Order, 1929, there shall be substituted the words “fifty-five shillings” in place of the words “forty-five shillings” wherever such words occur.

3. This Order may be cited as the Tuberculosis (Amendment) Order, 1931.
