**PSITTACOSIS.**

**Parrots (Prohibition of Import) Regulations, 1930**

HIS EXCELLENCY THE LIEUTENANT-GOVERNOR has issued a Proclamation (a copy of which is appended), under the Local Government (Consolidation) Act, 1916, embodying certain Regulations made by the Local Government Board, continuing in force the Regulations, dated the 23rd May, 1930, as amended by the Regulations dated the 11th July, 1930, made by the Board with a view to preventing, mitigating, and guarding against the spreading of Psittacosis.

Any person who wilfully violates any of the said Regulations is liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty Pounds.

## A PROCLAMATION.

The Local Government Board for the Isle of Man having made regulations in the following terms :—

The Local Government Board in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by Section 195 of the Local Government Consolidation Act, 1916, and of all other powers it enabling hereby makes the following Regulations, that is to say :—

The Parrots (Prohibition of Import) Regulations, 1930, made by the Board on the 23rd day of May, 1930, and the Parrots (Prohibition of Import) Amendment Regulations, 1930, made by the Board on the 11th day of July, 1930, are hereby continued in force throughout this Isle for one year from the 23rd day of May, 1931.

This 24th day of April, 1931.

I, the said Lieutenant Governor, by virtue of the powers and authority in me vested, do hereby order and direct that due observance of the said Regulations be had throughout this Isle.
