## The Cattle Diseases Prevention Act, 1929.

### THE SHEEP SCAB (AMENDMENT) ORDER, 1932.

---

His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor has issued an Order dated the 25th January, 1932, (a copy of which is appended), under the Cattle Diseases Prevention Act, 1929, prohibiting the sale of store or breeding sheep between the 1st August and the 31st October in any year unless the sheep have been previously dipped during that period and notice of dipping has been furnished as required by the Sheep Scab Order, 1928.

The new Order revokes the article of the Sheep Scab Order, 1928, under which a person, who provided facilities for dipping sheep on payment of a fee, was required to furnish notice in accordance with that Order of the dipping of all sheep dipped in such person's dipper. The responsibility of furnishing notice of sheep dipping as required by the Sheep Scab Order, 1928, now devolves on the owner or the person in charge of sheep.

## The Sheep Scab (Amendment) Order, 1932.

---

BY VIRTUE of the power and authority in me in that behalf vested by the  
Cattle Diseases Prevention Act, 1929, I, the said Lieutenant Governor,  
do hereby order as follows:—

1. No sheep for store or breeding purposes shall be sold between the  
1st day of August and the 31st day of October in any year unless such  
sheep shall have been dipped between the 1st day of August in that  
year and the date of their sale and notice of dipping has been furnished  
as required by Articles 4 and 5 of the <sup>Sheep Scab</sup>~~Scab~~ Order, 1928.
2. Article 6 of the Sheep Scab Order, 1928, is hereby revoked.
3. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires, the expressions  
used therein shall have the same meanings as in the Sheep Scab Order,  
1928.
4. This Order may be cited as "The Sheep Scab (Amendment) Order,  
1932."
