



VISIT OF HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS PRINCE GEORGE

ON

June 9th, 10th and 11th, 1932.

PROGRAMME

The following details in connection with the Royal Visit are announced for the information of all concerned.

THURSDAY, 9th June, 1932.

3 p.m. His Royal Highness will arrive by aeroplane at Ronaldsway, Malew, and will be received on arrival by His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor.

The following will be present and will be presented to His Royal Highness:—

The Bishop of Sodor and Man; the First Deemster; the Second Deemster; the Attorney-General; the Speaker of the House of Keys; the Government Secretary; the High-Bailiff of Douglas and Castletown; the High-Bailiff of Ramsey and Peel; and the Chief Constable.

Owing to the uncertainty of direction in which His Royal Highness will land, due to atmospheric conditions, no person will enter the landing place until the aeroplane is at rest.

Cars will be at Ronaldsway to convey His Royal Highness Prince George and His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, via Derby Haven and King William's College to the Castletown Brewery, where His Royal Highness will turn on a brew. Proceeding thence to Castle Rushen, His Royal Highness will be received at the Entrance to the Castle by a Guard of Honour of the King William's College O.T.C.

3-15 p.m. An Address of Welcome to His Royal Highness will be presented by the Castletown Town Commissioners at the Draw-bridge of the Castle.

7-45 p.m. His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor and Lady Hill will give a dinner party, in honour of His Royal Highness, at Government House, followed by a Reception at 9-30 p.m.

FRIDAY, 10th June, 1932.

9-20 a.m. His Royal Highness Prince George, accompanied by His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor and Lady Hill and the rest of the house party, will proceed by motor car to the Grand Stand to witness the Senior Tourist Trophy Race. His Royal Highness will be received at the Grand Stand by the Stewards of the Meeting, the Clerk of the Course, and the Chairman of the Isle of Man Highway Board.

12-30 p.m. His Royal Highness Prince George, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor and party, will take luncheon at the Grand Stand with the Stewards of the Meeting.

1-30 p.m. His Royal Highness Prince George, accompanied by the Second Deemster, will leave the Grand Stand for Peel Castle, where he will be received by members of the Legislature, and by the Peel Town Commissioners.

2-10 p.m. An Address of Welcome will be presented by the Peel Town Commissioners to His Royal Highness at the entrance to the Castle.

2-50 p.m. His Royal Highness Prince George, accompanied by the Second Deemster, will leave Peel Castle for Tynwald Hill, where he will inspect the Roll of Honour at St. John's Chapel, and lay a wreath on the National War Memorial.

3-15 p.m. His Royal Highness will visit the Tynwald Mills at St. John's.

3-50 p.m. His Royal Highness, accompanied by the Second Deemster, will leave St. John's for Cronkbourne, the residence of the Speaker of the House of Keys, where Members of the House of Keys will be presented by the Speaker to His Royal Highness.

4-30 p.m. The Speaker, together with the Members of the House of Keys, will leave Cronkbourne for Noble's Isle of Man Hospital.

- 4-50 p.m. His Royal Highness Prince George, after having taken tea at Cronkbourne, will leave Cronkbourne for Noble's Isle of Man Hospital, accompanied by Mrs. Clucas (wife of the Speaker) and the Second Deemster.
- 5 p.m. His Royal Highness Prince George will arrive at Noble's Isle of Man Hospital, where he will be met at the entrance to the building by His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, and received by the Chairman (Mr. G. F. Clucas, C.B.E., S.H.K.), who will present to His Royal Highness the Chairmen of the Sub-Committees of the Hospital, and Members of the Staff, in the Committee Room.
- 5-15 p.m. His Royal Highness will be conducted to the dais on the Verandah of the new wing.

6 p.m. His Royal Highness will make a tour of the Wards.
- 6 p.m. His Royal Highness will return to Government House.
- 7-45 p.m. His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor and Lady Hill will give a dinner party, in honour of His Royal Highness, at Government House.
- 9-20 p.m. His Royal Highness, accompanied by His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor and party, will leave for Villa Marina.
- 9-30 p.m. His Royal Highness will present, at Villa Marina, the Trophies to the successful competitors in the Senior Tourist Trophy Race.

SATURDAY, 11th June, 1932.

- 10-30 a.m. His Royal Highness will leave Government House, and proceed by way of Glencrutchery Road, Bray Hill, Quarter Bridge, etc., along the Tourist Trophy Course, to Ramsey.
- 11-30 a.m. An Address of Welcome will be presented by the Ramsey Town Commissioners in the square facing the Town Hall.
- 11-45 a.m. His Royal Highness will leave Ramsey, and still proceeding along the Tourist Trophy Course, via the Mountain Road, Hilberry, and Governor's Bridge, will continue along Victoria Road, Broadway, the Promenade and Victoria Street, to the Town Hall, Douglas.

12-30 p.m. His Royal Highness will be received at the Town Hall, Douglas, by the Mayor and Corporation of Douglas, who will present an Address of Welcome to His Royal Highness.

Before entering the Town Hall, His Royal Highness will inspect members of the Manx Legion drawn up in front of the Town Hall.

1 p.m. His Royal Highness will leave the Town Hall and proceed via the Promenade to Castle Mona Hotel.

1-15 p.m. His Royal Highness will be the Guest of Honour of the Rotary Club at Luncheon at Castle Mona Hotel.

After Luncheon His Royal Highness will proceed to Ronaldsway and embark in his aeroplane.
