



## IMPORT DUTIES

### MANDATED TERRITORIES PREFERENCE ORDER 1932.

His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor has made an Order (a copy of which is appended) under Section 3 of the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1932, declaring that such section shall apply to (a) The Tanganyika Territory, (b) the Cameroons under British Mandate, and (c) Togoland under British Mandate, as if such territories were territories under His Majesty's protection.

ORDER, dated the 13th day of May, 1932, made by Sir Claude Hamilton Archer Hill, K.C.S.I., C.I.E., Lieutenant Governor of the Isle of Man, under section 3 (2) of the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1932.

WHEREAS by section 3 (2) of the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1932, it is provided that at any time after an Order has been made by His Majesty in Council under subsection (2) of section five of the Import Duties Act, 1932, (an Act of the Imperial Parliament) as regards any territory in respect of which a mandate of the League of Nations is being exercised by the Government of the United Kingdom, the Governor may, by Order declare that such section shall apply to that territory as if it were a territory under His Majesty's protection.

AND WHEREAS His Majesty has been pleased by Order under section five of the said Import Duties Act, 1932, to declare that such Section shall apply to:—

- (a) The Tanganyika Territory.
- (b) the Cameroons under British Mandate.
- (c) Togoland under British Mandate

as if these territories were Territories under His Majesty's protection.

NOW, THEREFORE, I the said Lieutenant Governor, in pursuance of the power conferred on me by the said Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1932, do hereby declare that section 3 of the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1932, shall apply to the above named Territories as if they were Territories under His Majesty's protection.

This Order may be cited as the Mandate Territories Preference Order 1932.
