The Herring Fishery (Branding) Act, 1916.

OFFICIAL BRANDING OF HERRINGS IN DOUGLAS, PEEL AND PORT ST. MARY.

His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, having been satisfied that there is a general desire on the part of the curers of herrings carrying on business in the ports of Douglas, Peel and Port St. Mary that Section 2 of the Herring Fishery (Branding) Act, 1916, should be extended to those ports, has made an Order, dated the 24th day of June, 1932, a copy of which is appended, extending such Section to the ports beforementioned.

The Order will come into force on the 18th day of July, 1932.

WHEREAS it has been shown to my satisfaction that there is a general desire on the part of the curers of herring carrying on business in the ports of Douglas, Peel and Port St. Mary that Section 2 of the Herring Fishery (Branding) Act, 1916, shall be put into force in the said ports.

AND WHEREAS notice, bearing date the 18th day of March, 1932, was duly given in the "Isle of Man Times," the "Isle of Man Examiner," and the "Peel City Guardian," that I proposed to make an Order under Section 2 of the said Act, declaring that the said Section 2 shall be put into force in the aforesaid ports.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, the said Lieutenant Governor, by virtue of the powers conferred upon me by the aforesaid Act, DO hereby declare that Section 2 of the Herring Fishery (Branding) Act, 1932, shall be in force in the aforesaid ports of Douglas, Peel and Port St. Mary.

AND, I do further declare that this Order shall come into operation on the 18th day of July, 1932.
