



Additional Import Duties (No. 1) Order, 1932

His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor has made an Order (a copy of which is appended) under Sub-section (1) of Section Two of the Isle of Man (Customs) (No. 2) Act, 1932, directing that on the removal or importation into this Isle of goods of such classes and descriptions as are specified in the principal Treasury Order, there shall be payable, subject to and in accordance with that Order, such additional duties of customs as are specified therein.

CUSTOMS.

ADDITIONAL IMPORT DUTIES (No. 1) ORDER, 1932.

Whereas it is provided by sub-section (1) of section two of the Isle of Man (Customs) (No. 2) Act, 1932 (an Act of the Imperial Parliament) that the Governor may from time to time by order direct that on the removal or importation into this Isle of goods of such classes and descriptions as are specified in any order for the time being in force made by the Treasury under section three of the Import Duties Act, 1932 (an Act of the Imperial Parliament) there shall be payable, subject to and in accordance with the Treasury order, such additional duties of customs as are specified in the Treasury order:

And whereas by sub-section (3) of the said section two any duty payable by virtue of an order made under that section is to be payable as from such date as may be specified in the order, not being earlier than the date of the order or the date from which the duty is payable under the corresponding Treasury order, except that in a case where before the commencement of the Act Tynwald had resolved in accordance with section two of the Isle of Man Customs Act, 1887, that it was expedient to impose the duties of customs specified in any such Treasury order, the order made by the Governor may direct that those duties shall be payable as from the date of the resolution:

And whereas the Treasury on the nineteenth day of April, nineteen hundred and thirty-two, made an order (in this order referred to as "the principal Treasury order") under the said Import Duties Act imposing certain additional duties of customs on goods of certain classes and descriptions:

And whereas on the twenty-sixth day of April, nineteen hundred and thirty-two, Tynwald resolved that it was expedient to impose the duties of customs specified in the principal Treasury order:

And whereas by subsequent orders under the said Act, the Treasury made certain amendments in the principal Treasury order:

Now, therefore, I the said Lieutenant-Governor, by virtue of the powers conferred on me by section two of the Isle of Man (Customs) (No. 2) Act, 1932, and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf hereby make the following order:

1. As from the date of the making of this order there shall, on the removal or importation into this Isle of goods of such classes and descriptions as are specified in the principal Treasury order, be payable, subject to and in accordance with that order, such additional duties of customs as are specified therein:

Provided that such of the duties specified in the First Schedule to the principal Treasury order as were imposed by the said resolution of Tynwald of the twenty-sixth day of April shall be payable as from the date of that resolution.

2. References in paragraph 1 of this order to the principal Treasury order shall be construed as references to that order as amended by any Treasury Order made before the date of the making of this order.

3. This order may be cited as the Additional Import Duties (No. 1) Order, 1932.
