



Import Duties (Exemptions) (No. 2) Order, 1932.

His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor has made an Order (a copy of which is appended) under Subsection (3) of Section one of the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1932, directing that the goods specified in the Schedule to such Order shall be added to the First Schedule to the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1932.

ORDER dated the 12th day of August, 1932, made by Sir Claude Hamilton Archer Hill, K.C.S.I., C.I.E., Lieutenant Governor of the Isle of Man, under subsection (3) of section one of the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1932.

WHEREAS it is provided by subsection (3) of section one of the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1932, that at any time after an Order has been made by the Treasury under subsection (3) of section one of the Import Duties Act, 1932, directing that goods of any class and description shall be added to the First schedule to that Act, the Governor may by Order direct that goods of that class and description shall be added to the First schedule to the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1932.

AND WHEREAS it is provided by subsection (3) of section one of the Isle of Man (Customs) (No. 2) Act, 1932, that any Order made by the Governor under the said section one of the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1932, shall (if it has not previously ceased to have effect) cease to have effect on the expiration of twenty eight days from the date on which Tynwald next sits after the making of the Order, unless at some time before the expiration of that period it has been approved by resolution passed by Tynwald.

AND WHEREAS the Treasury has by Order dated 12th July, 1932, added to the First schedule to the Import Duties Act, 1932, the articles specified in the schedule to such Order.

NOW, THEREFORE, I the said Lieutenant Governor, by virtue of the powers conferred on me by section one of the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1932, and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, hereby make the following Order:—

1. The goods specified in the schedule to this Order shall be added to the First schedule to the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1932.
2. This Order may be cited as the Import Duties (Exemptions) (No. 2) Order, 1932.
3. This Order shall take effect as from the 12th day of August, 1932.

SCHEDULE.

All articles liable to duty under the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1932, consigned to any gallery or museum under the control of a Public Authority or University in the Isle of Man approved for the purpose of this provision by the Governor, or any other

Institution or Body so approved, and declared by the consignee in a form approved by the Commissioners of Customs and Excise to be imported solely for use as exhibits or specimens and not for sale.

Paintings in oil or water colours, pencil and charcoal drawings, and pastels, on canvas or paper (including board).

Roundwood logs of pine, spruce, and aspen in the natural state or free from bark or bast, not hewn or sawn except cross cut at the ends, in lengths not exceeding 50 inches, the top diameter not being more than 12 inches.

Common reeds (*phragmites communis*), crushed and baled.

Glycol ethers and glycol ether-esters.

Bromine.

Crude boron minerals and concentrates of boracite and rasorite.

Rags, partly of wool, not pulled.

Natural but not terpenes essential oils, the following:—

Aniseed.

Bois de rose.

Brown Camphor.

Bergamot.

Geranium.

Lavender.

Lemon.

Peppermint.
