



## ISLE OF MAN (CUSTOMS) ACT, 1927.

His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor has made an Order (a Copy of which is appended) under Section 15 of the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1927, exempting from duties of Customs, certain specified dutiable articles on importation into the Isle of Man, for a period ending on the 31st December, 1933.

ORDER dated the 14th day of September, 1932, made by Sir Claude Hamilton Archer Hill, K.C.S.I., C.I.E., Lieutenant Governor of the Isle of Man, under section 15 of the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1927 (17 and 18 George V. Ch. 20).

WHEREAS section 15 of the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1927, confers power on the Lieutenant Governor, with reference to the duty imposed by section 13 of the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1926, to exempt from duty any article mentioned in the Order which is liable to duty under such section where he is satisfied (inter alia) that an Order has been made by the Treasury under sub-section (5) of Section 10 of the Finance Act, 1926 (an Act of the Imperial Parliament) exempting the article from the duty imposed by Section 1 of the Safeguarding of Industries Act, 1921, as amended by any subsequent enactment.

AND WHEREAS the Lieutenant Governor is satisfied as respects the articles specified in this Order it is inexpedient, having regard to the Order made by the Treasury under subsection (5) of Section 10 of the Finance Act, 1926, dated the 30th day of August, 1932, that duty should be charged thereon under Section 13 of the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1926, for the period ending on the 31st day of December, 1933.

NOW, THEREFORE, I the said Lieutenant Governor, in pursuance of the power conferred on me by the said Act, DO HEREBY ORDER as follows:—

Such amorphous carbon electrodes over three feet long, the cross section of which exceeds twelve inches in both length and breadth, with longitudinal slots exceeding two inches in width and four inches in depth as are not entered under the Customs Acts before the 14th day of September, 1932, or which have not been removed from a bonded warehouse before that date, shall be exempt from the duty imposed by Section 13 of the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1926, for a period ending on the 31st day of December, 1933.
