### **The Movement of Swine (Amendment) Order, 1932.**

His Excellency the Deputy Governor has issued an Order, dated the 23rd November, 1932, (a copy of which is appended), under the Cattle Diseases Prevention Act, 1929, suspending, as from the 1st December, 1932, until further Order, certain Articles of the Proclamation made by His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor on the 18th January, 1921, in regard to the movement of swine in the Isle of Man.

The effect of the new Order is that, on and after the 1st December, 1932, it will not be necessary to obtain a licence from the Police or the Clerks to the Village or Parish Commissioners in order to move swine from one destination to another.

The provisions of the Proclamation of 1921 for the registration of regular dealers in stock as dealers in swine still remain operative and it is still necessary for registered dealers in swine and proprietors of Marts to keep registers in the prescribed form recording particulars of each transaction in swine.

**The Movement of Swine (Amendment) Order, 1932.**

BY VIRTUE of the power and authority in me in that behalf  
vested by the Cattle Diseases Prevention Act, 1929, I, the said Deputy  
Governor, do hereby order as follows :—

1. The operation of Articles 1, 2, 6, 7, 8, 10, and 11 of the  
Proclamation issued by the Lieutenant Governor on the  
18th day of January, 1921, in regard to the movement of  
swine, shall be suspended as from the 1st day of December,  
1932, until further order.
2. This Order may be cited as the “Movement of Swine (Amend-  
ment) Order, 1932.”
