



Import Duties (Exemptions) (No. 5) Order.

His Excellency the Deputy-Governor has made an Order (a copy of which is appended) under Subsection (3) of Section one of the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1932, directing that the goods specified in the Schedule to such Order shall be added to the First Schedule to the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1932.

ORDER dated the Sixth day of January, 1933, made by FREDERICK MALCOLM LaMOTHE Esquire, Deputy Governor of the Isle of Man, under subsection (3) of section one of the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1932.

WHEREAS it is provided by subsection (3) of section one of the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1932, that at any time after an order has been made by the Treasury under subsection (3) of section one of the Import Duties Act, 1932, (an Act of the Imperial Parliament) directing that goods of any class and description shall be added to the First Schedule to that Act, the Governor may by Order direct that goods of that class and description shall be added to the First Schedule to the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1932.

AND WHEREAS it is provided by subsection (3) of section one of the Isle of Man (Customs) (No. 2) Act, 1932, that any Order made by the Governor under the said section one of the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1932, shall (if it has not previously ceased to have effect) cease to have effect on the expiration of twenty eight days from the date on which Tynwald next sits after the making of the Order unless at some time before the expiration of that period it has been approved by resolution passed by Tynwald.

AND WHEREAS the Treasury has by the Import Duties (Exemptions) (No 5) Order, 1932, added to the First Schedule to the Import Duties Act, 1932, the articles specified in the Schedule to such Order.

NOW, THEREFORE, I the said Deputy Governor, by virtue of the powers conferred on me by section one of the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1932, and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, hereby make the following Order:—

1. The Goods specified in the Schedule to this Order shall be added to the First Schedule to the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1932.
2. The additional duty chargeable under the Additional Import Duties (No. 1) Order, 1932, on beads shall cease to be chargeable on the beads specified in paragraph 4 of the Schedule to this Order, and accordingly the Additional Import Duties No. 1 Order, 1932, shall be read and construed as if the principal Treasury Order therein referred to were amended as follows:—
in the First Schedule to such Order there shall be treated as being inserted after the word "beads" the words "(except beads not mounted, set or strung, of a size or shape adapted for use in articles of jewellery or imitation jewellery, being beads of any of the following materials, that is to say:— artificial pearls; non-precious or imitation stones, including those made of glass; imitations of tortoiseshell, of mother of pearl, of amber, or of coral; shells; seeds; bones)."
3. This Order may be cited as the Import Duties (Exemptions) (No. 5) Order.
4. This Order shall take effect as from the Sixth day of January, 1933.

SCHEDULE.

1. Manila hemp (*musa textilis*) not further dressed after scutching or decorticating ; tow of manila hemp (*musa textilis*).
2. Iron Bromide.
3. Bristles of the pig, hog or boar imported in bundles or bunches which consist exclusively of such bristles and in which the bristles are laid parallel, excluding bundles or bunches which are in a state ready, or substantially ready, for incorporation in a brush or broom.
4. The following articles of a size and shape adapted for use in articles of jewellery or imitation jewellery, not mounted, set or strung, viz :—
 - Artificial pearls.
 - Non-precious and imitation stones including those made of glass.
 - Imitations of tortoiseshell, mother of pearl, amber or coral.
 - Beads made of the above-mentioned materials or of shells, seeds, or bones.
5. Foreign Patent Office specifications.
6. Tantalum metal in the form of powder, sheet, plate, bar, wire or tube, but not including alloys of tantalum.
