



GOVERNMENT ASSISTED FARM LABOUR.

Scheme for Assisting Farmers to Employ Additional Men on Farm Work.

Any person, being the owner or occupier of agricultural land shall be entitled to Government assisted labour between the 1st February and 31st March, 1933, subject to the following conditions:—

- (1) A written undertaking shall be given by each applicant that the same number of permanent men employed by him or her in June 1932 shall, during the period 1st February and 31st March, 1933, continue to be employed by him or her during this period.
- (2) Applicants will be required to select the additional men to be employed from the Register of Unemployed.
- (3) The additional men to be employed will be paid the same rate of wages, work the same number of hours, and be subject to the same general customary conditions affecting labour as obtain on the farms in the district where they may be employed.
- (4) The Government Treasurer, out of moneys provided by Tynwald, will refund to employers of men taken up under this scheme 50% of the wages paid in respect of each additional man employed. Where board and lodgings are provided, the value of such board and lodgings will be deemed to be equal to 50% of the wages earned. Forms for claiming from the Government Treasurer the contributions due will be supplied to employers by the Registrar of Unemployment, Drill Hall, Douglas.
- (5) Forms of Application for assisted labour can be obtained from the Secretary, Board of Agriculture, Athol Street, Douglas.
- (6) The Secretary, Board of Agriculture, after the Board of Agriculture has approved an application for additional men, will notify the Registrar of Unemployed, Drill Hall, of the name of the applicant and the number of men proposed to be employed. The Registrar will thereupon provide the applicant with information in regard to registered unemployed men available.
