



## Import Duties (Exemptions) (No. 8) Order.

His Excellency the Lieutenant - Governor has made an Order (a copy of which is appended) under Subsection (1) of Section one of the Isle of Man (Customs) (No. 2) Act, 1932, directing that the goods specified in the Schedule to such Order shall cease to be included in the First Schedule to the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1932.

ISLE OF MAN  
TO WIT.

ORDER dated the eleventh day of April, 1933, made by Sir Claude Hamilton Archer Hill, K.C.S.I., C.I.E., Lieutenant-Governor of the Isle of Man, under subsection 1 of section one of the Isle of Man (Customs) (No. 2) Act, 1932.

WHEREAS it is provided by subsection 1 of section one of the Isle of Man (Customs) (No. 2) Act, 1932, that where an Order is made by the Treasury under section seven of the Finance Act, 1932 (an Act of the Imperial Parliament), directing that goods of any class or description for the time being included in the First Schedule to the Import Duties Act, 1932 (an Act of the Imperial Parliament), shall cease to be so included, the Governor may by Order direct that goods of the classes and descriptions specified in the Treasury Order shall cease to be included in the First Schedule to the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1932.

AND WHEREAS the Treasury has by the Import Duties (Exemptions) (No. 2) Order, 1933, removed from the First Schedule to the Import Duties Act, 1932, the goods specified in the Schedule to such Order.

NOW, THEREFORE, I the said Lieutenant-Governor, by virtue of the powers conferred on me by subsection 1 of section one of the Isle of Man (Customs) (No. 2) Act, 1932, hereby make the following Order:—

1. The goods specified in the Schedule to this Order shall cease to be included in the First Schedule to the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1932.
2. This Order may be cited as the Import Duties (Exemptions) (No. 8) Order.
3. This Order shall come into operation on the 11th day of April, 1933.

### SCHEDULE.

Unset precious stones of the following description, that is to say, unmounted diamonds drilled so as to be adapted for use in wire-drawing dies.
