

MOTOR CAR RACES, JULY, 1933.

The Government Property Trustees have given consideration to the use to which the Government property situated on the course should be put, and they have decided as follows :-

- (1) Government Office, and the courtyard in front of the front door, shall be for the use of the staff of Government Office, under arrangements to be made by the Government Secretary, each member of the staff being allotted one ticket in addition to a ticket for himself.
- (2) The Legislative Council Chamber windows shall be set apart for the use of Members of the Legislative Council, two tickets being issued to each Member of the Legislative Council by the Government Secretary.
- (3) The Courtyards in front of the Tynwald Chamber and House of Keys shall be reserved for Members of the House of Keys, two tickets being issued by the Government Secretary to each Member, so that a Member can bring a relative or friend to witness the Races.
- (4) The Garden in front of H.M.Prison shall be reserved for the liberty Prison officers and their families, under arrangements to be made by the Gaoler.
- (5) Bemahague. Those fields which are tenanted by Mr. Kelly shall be available to the public should Mr. Kelly so wish, under arrangements to be submitted to and approved by the Government Secretary.

(6) Plantation between Sunnyside and Governor's Bridge.

On account of the number of young trees growing in this plantation, no person is to be admitted thereto.

(7) Manx Museum. Facilities for witnessing the Races from the grounds above Finch Road to be restricted to the Trustees of the Museum and the staff of the Museum, each Trustee and each Member of the staff to be entitled to two tickets, one for himself and one for a relative or friend. These tickets will be supplied by the Government Secretary for issue by the Secretary.

(8) Rolls Office. To be reserved for the Deemsters, the Attorney General and the staffs of the offices accommodated in the building. The Government Secretary will supply tickets for issue under arrangements to be made by the First Deemster and Clerk of the Rolls.
