



ISLE OF MAN (CUSTOMS) ACT, 1927.

His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor has made an Order (a Copy of which is appended) under Section 15 of the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1927, exempting from duties of Customs, certain dutiable articles on their importation into the Isle of Man.

ORDER dated the Ninth day of May, 1933, made by Sir CLAUDE HAMILTON ARCHER HILL, K.C.S.I., C.I.E., Lieutenant Governor of the Isle of Man, under Section 13 of the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1926, as amended by Section 15 of the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1927, (17 and 18 George V. Ch. 20).

WHEREAS Section 15 of the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1927, provides that the Lieutenant Governor may by Order exempt any articles mentioned in the Order which are liable to duty under Section 13 of the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1926, if he is satisfied that, having regard to the nature or small value of the article, it is expedient that the duty should be charged.

AND WHEREAS Section 16 of the aforesaid Act of 1927 provides that any Order made by the Governor under any section of that Act or under any other enactment for exempting any articles from duties of Customs may be varied or amended by another order made under Section 15 of the said Act of 1927 or under that other enactment, as the case may be.

AND WHEREAS on the twenty-first day of October, 1926, the Lieutenant Governor by virtue of the powers conferred on him by the aforesaid Section 13 of the said Act of 1926, made an Order whereby it was provided, inter alia, that the following articles should be exempt from the duty imposed thereon by Section 13 of the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1926, that is to say, complete optical lanterns not exceeding a value of two shillings each, and complete cinematographs not exceeding a value of three shillings each.

AND WHEREAS it appears to the Lieutenant Governor, that it is expedient to make such an Order as is hereinafter contained.

NOW, THEREFORE, I the said Lieutenant Governor, in pursuance of the power conferred on me by the said Act, DO HEREBY ORDER as follows:—

Paragraphs numbered 9 and 10 of Part 2 of the Schedule to the said Order dated the twenty-first day of October, nineteen hundred and twenty-six, shall, as from the tenth day of May, nineteen hundred and thirty-three, have effect with the substitution therein for the words "two shillings" of the words "four shillings" and for the words "three shillings" of the words "ten shillings."
