The rates specified in column 2 are for a period of 24 hours' absence from home and headquarters, and must include any additional absence at the end of the period which does not of itself qualify for a day allowance.

\* Special duty, in the case of Sergeants and Constables, means a tour of duty authorised by the Superior Officer of the District.

† Unless travelling in uniform when First-Class Railway fare may be claimed.

In all cases of Senior Officers proceeding from the Island, official sanction must be obtained from Government Office.

Cabs, postages, telegrams, and all necessary outlay incidental to the special duty on which an Officer is detailed, to be in addition.
