



Import Duties (Exemptions) (No. 13) Order.

His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor has made an Order (a Copy of which is appended) under Subsection (3) of Section twelve of the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1933, directing that the general ad valorem duty shall not be charged on goods of the classes and descriptions specified in the Schedule to such Order.

Isle of Man to Wit.

ORDER dated the eighteenth day of August, 1933, made by Sir Claude Hamilton Archer Hill, K.C.S.I., C.I.E., Lieutenant Governor of the Isle of Man under section twelve of the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1933.

WHEREAS it is provided by Section twelve of the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1933, that subject to the provisions of such section, the Governor may by Order direct in relation to any class or description of goods specified in an Order for the time being in force made by the Treasury under Section fourteen of the Finance Act, 1933, (an Act of the Imperial Parliament) that in the case either:—

- (a) of goods of that class or description wheresoever grown, produced or manufactured; or
- (b) of goods of that class or description grown, produced or manufactured in any countries to which the Order is expressed to apply or manufactured partly in one and partly in another of any such countries;

that the general ad valorem duty or any additional duty or both those duties shall be payable at the reduced rate specified in the Treasury Order, or, if the Treasury Order so provides, shall not be payable.

AND WHEREAS the general ad valorem duty is chargeable under Part 1 of the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1932, on goods of the classes and descriptions specified in the Schedule to this Order.

AND WHEREAS the Treasury has by Order dated the 5th July, 1933, entitled the Import Duties (Exemptions) (No. 7) Order, 1933, exempted from the general ad valorem duty goods of the classes and descriptions specified in the Schedule to such Order being goods in the case of which such Order for the time being has effect.

NOW, THEREFORE, I the said Lieutenant Governor, by virtue of the powers conferred on me by section twelve of the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1933, and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, hereby make the following Order:—

1. (1) The general ad valorem duty shall not be charged on

goods of the classes and descriptions specified in the Schedule to this Order being goods in the case of which this Order for the time being has effect.

- (2) Unless and until the Governor by Order otherwise directs, this Order shall have effect in the case of goods of the said classes and descriptions wheresoever grown, produced or manufactured.
2. This Order may be cited as the Import Duties (Exemptions) (No. 13) ORDER.
3. This Order shall come into operation on the 19th day of August, 1933.

SCHEDULE.

Bilberries.

Calcium Carbide.

Calcium Cyanamide (or Cyanamide of Lime).

Carborundum, crude, ground or graded but not further manufactured.

Felspar, raw, including crushed but not ground.

Ferro-Manganese, refined, containing less than 3 per cent carbon.

Ferro-silicon, containing not less than 35 per cent of silicon.

Hay and Straw.

Herring meal.

Iron ore and iron concentrates in the form of briquettes.

Iron and Steel of the following descriptions.

Pig iron, smelted wholly with charcoal.

Vanadium-titanium pig iron produced in an electric furnace.

Ingots manufactured entirely from pig iron smelted wholly with charcoal.

Blooms, billets, slabs, bars and rods of wrought iron produced by puddling with charcoal from pig iron smelted wholly with charcoal.

Bandsaw strip, over 4 inches wide and from 19 to 12 gauge (Birmingham wire gauge) in thickness.

Nickel, unwrought, in ingots, cathodes, cubes, pellets, shot and grain, but not including alloys of nickel.

Nitrate of Lime.

Rock Crystal Quartz, raw, including crushed.

Silico-manganese.

Talc, steatite and soapstone, whether ground or not.

Wooden telegraph poles not less than 20 feet and not more than 40 feet in length and not less than 5 inches and not more than $9\frac{3}{4}$ inches in top diameter and not less than 6 inches in diameter 5 feet from the butt end.

Whale Oil and hardened whale oil.
