### The Removal of Bodies from the Isle of Man Regulations, 1933.

---

---

The Registrar-General for the Isle of Man, in exercise of powers afforded by paragraph (a) of Section 10 of the Civil Registration and Dissenters' Marriage Act, 1933, and with the concurrence of His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, has made Regulations (a copy of which is appended) relating to the removal out of the Isle of Man of bodies of deceased persons.

The Regulations take effect as from the 4th October, 1933.

The Removal of Bodies from the Isle of Man Regulations, 1933, dated 4th October, 1933, made under Paragraph (a) of Section 10 of the Civil Registration and Dissenters' Marriage Act, 1933, by the Registrar-General with the concurrence of the Lieutenant-Governor and relating to the Removal out of the Isle of Man of Bodies of Deceased Persons.

The Registrar-General, in exercise of powers conferred on him by paragraph (a) of Section 10 of the Civil Registration and Dissenters' Marriage Act, 1933, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, with the concurrence of the Lieutenant-Governor hereby makes the following Regulations:

1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as "The Removal of Bodies from the Isle of Man Regulations, 1933."

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1865, applies to the interpretation of these Regulations as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Tynwald.

2. Every person intending to remove out of the Isle of Man the body of a deceased person shall give notice of his intention in the form set forth in the First Schedule to these Regulations, or in a form substantially to the like effect, to the coroner of inquests for the district in which the body is lying, and where the deceased person died in the Isle of Man shall send or deliver to the coroner, together with such notice, the certificate given by the registrar under Section 3 of the Civil Registration and Dissenters' Marriage Act, 1933, that he has registered the death of the deceased person.

3. Upon receiving the notice the coroner shall forthwith send or deliver to the person by whom the notice was given or to the undertaker or other person designated by that person for the purpose an acknowledgment of the receipt of the notice in the form set forth in the Second Schedule to these Regulations, or in a form substantially to the like effect, specifying the date on which the notice was received and shall, at the same time, return the certificate to the registrar by whom it was given and notify him that a notice of intention to remove the body has been received.

4. The body shall not be removed out of the Isle of Man before the expiration of a period of four clear days after the day on which notice of intention to remove the body was received by the coroner:

Provided that where the coroner states in his acknowledgment of the receipt of the notice that he does not intend to hold an inquest, the body may be removed at any time after the acknowledgment has been received by the person to whom it is addressed, notwithstanding that the said period of four clear days has not expired.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

Article 2. Form of Notice to a Coroner of Intention to Remove a Body out of the Isle of Man.

(a) If the death took place out of the Isle of Man, this paragraph should be crossed out.

(b) This paragraph is for use only where the person giving notice desires the Coroner's acknowledgment to be sent to some other person.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

Article 3. Form of Acknowledgment by Coroner of Receipt of Notice of Intention to Remove a Body out of the Isle of Man.
