Arrival of His Excellency Sir Montagu Butler

K.C.S.I., C.B., C.I.E., C.V.O., C.B.E.

8th November, 1933.

1. His Excellency Sir Montagu Butler, K.C.S.I., C.B., C.I.E., C.V.O., C.B.E., will arrive in the Island by the Steamer reaching Douglas about 2-30 p.m. on 8th November, 1933.
2. The Isle of Man Harbour Commissioners have arranged that the roadway of the Pier will be reserved for the Members of the Legislature, officials, and members of the public bodies enumerated below, and the public will not be admitted thereto.
3. His Excellency will be met on the Steamer by the Government Secretary and the Chief Constable, and will come ashore 15 minutes after the vessel has been berthed.
4. The Receiver-General, as Chairman of the Isle of Man Harbour Commissioners, accompanied by the Secretary and the Chief Engineer to the Commissioners and the Harbour Master of Douglas, will be presented to His Excellency at the steamer's gangway.
5. His Worship the Mayor of Douglas, who will be accompanied by the Town Clerk, will be presented to His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor outside the Harbour Master's office at the Pier Head.
6. At a position lower down the Pier there will be presented to the Lieutenant-Governor the Members of the Legislative Council and the Deputy Clerk of the Council; the Speaker, Members, Secretary and Chaplain of the House of Keys; and the High-Bailiff.
7. The Captains of the Parishes, the Justices of the Peace, the members of the Town Council of Douglas, the Chairmen and the Clerks of the Commissioners of Town, Village and Parish Districts and representatives of the Press will be accommodated within the enclosure.
8. Tickets, which will not be transferable, authorising admission to the reserved portion of the Pier, will be issued to the above named from Government Office.

9. A Guard of Honour of the Officers' Training Corps, King William's College Contingent, will be mounted on the Pier in proximity to the Harbour Master's Office at the Pier Head, and will receive His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor with a Royal Salute. A detachment of the Manx Legion will take up an alignment on the right flank of the Officers' Training Corps.

9th November, 1933.

1. His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor will proceed to Castle Rushen, where he will take the Oath of Office at the Court House at 12 noon. He will be received at the Main Gate of the Castle by the Government Property Trustees and the High-Bailiff at 11-45 a.m.
2. On arrival of the Lieutenant-Governor in the Court House, the King's Warrant appointing Sir Montagu Butler Lieutenant-Governor will be read by the Government Secretary.
3. The Chief Clerk of the Rolls Office will hand to His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor the Staff of Office and the Liber Juramentorum.
4. His Honour the First Deemster and Clerk of the Rolls will address His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor and will administer the Oath of Allegiance and the Oath of Office.
5. After His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor has been sworn and has signed the Liber Juramentorum, the Chairman of the Castletown Town Commissioners will present an Address to His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor.
6. His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor will reply.
7. His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor will retire.

Only His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor and Lady Butler, the First Deemster and Clerk of the Rolls, the Government Secretary, the Chief Clerk of the Rolls Office and the Chairman of the Castletown Town Commissioners will occupy places on the Bench.

Admission to the Court will be by ticket only, to be issued to the Members of the Legislative Council, the Members of the House of Keys, and the principal officials, Captains of Parishes, Justices of the Peace, and the Castletown Town Commissioners with their Clerk.

Tickets, which will not be transferable, will be issued to the above-named in due course; they will be numbered and coloured blue. The numbers of the tickets will correspond with numbers on the seats.

There will be limited accommodation in the Court House for members of the public, and application to be present must be made in writing, addressed to the Government Secretary, Government Office, Douglas, before November 1st. The tickets, which will not be transferable, will be issued in order of priority of application, and will be white and numbered. The numbers on the tickets will correspond with the numbers on the seats.

Persons holding tickets will enter by the Main Gate of the Castle.

The Ceremony will be broadcast by the British Broadcasting Corporation, and arrangements will be made for a relay to the outer courtyard of the Castle, to which the public will be admitted without ticket by the private entrance adjoining the Main Gate.

8. A Guard of Honour of the Officers' Training Corps, King William's College Contingent, will be mounted at the entrance to Castle Rushen, and will receive His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor with a Royal Salute on arrival and departure.

10th November, 1933.

At 11 a.m. His Excellency the Lieutenant - Governor will arrive at Government Office where he will receive the members of the Civil Service and other officials summoned to attend.

On the occasion of the first sitting of the Legislative Council following His Excellency's arrival, the Lieutenant-Governor will receive the Members of the Council individually, and similarly on the first sitting of the House of Keys the Speaker and Members of the House of Keys will be received individually.

His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor on later dates will pay official visits to Douglas, Ramsey, Peel and Castletown, particulars of which will form the subject of another Circular.
