



The Defence Regulations (Isle of Man) 1939.

The Sugar (Regulation of Importation and Exportation) Order, 1940.

His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor has made an Order, a copy of which is appended, providing that on and after the 8th January, 1940, no sugar as defined in the Order shall be imported into or exported from the Isle of Man except under the authority of a licence issued on behalf of the Governor by the Government Secretary or other authorised officer.

Failure to comply with the terms of the Order renders a person liable to the penalties imposed by the Defence Regulations.

ISLE OF MAN TO WIT.

BY HIS EXCELLENCY VICE ADMIRAL THE RIGHT HONOURABLE THE EARL GRANVILLE, C.B., D.S.O., LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR OF THE SAID ISLE, &c., &c.

The Sugar (Regulation of Importation and Exportation) Order, 1940.

I, the said Lieutenant Governor, acting in pursuance of the powers vested in me by the Defence Regulations (Isle of Man) 1939, and all other powers me in that behalf enabling, Do hereby order as follows:

1. On and after the date when this Order comes into force, no sugar shall be imported into or exported from the Isle of Man except under the authority of a licence issued on my behalf by the Government Secretary or other duly authorised Officer and on such conditions and subject to such restrictions as may be specified in such licence.
2. Any officer of police or customs or any other person authorised by me in that behalf may examine any package which he has reason to believe contains any sugar which is intended for exportation from or has been imported into the Isle of Man in contravention of the terms of this Order and may for that purpose direct that any covering or wrapping shall be removed therefrom. He may seize and detain any sugar which has been submitted for exportation from or has been imported into the Isle of Man in contravention of the terms of this Order.
3. For the purposes of this Order, "sugar" means any sugar which has been subjected to any process rendering it suitable for human consumption, but does not include invert sugar, glucose, molasses, syrup, treacle or manufactured products containing sugar.
4. This Order may be cited as "The Sugar (Regulation of Importation and Exportation) Order, 1940" and shall come into force on the 8th day of January, 1940.
