Admission of Men under 40 years of Age.

His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor has authorised the admission to the Loyal Manx Association of able-bodied men between the ages of 35 and 60 who are prepared to be sworn as Special Constables and willing to discharge such duties in emergency or on ceremonial occasions as they may be reasonably expected to perform compatible with their normal occupations.

It will be understood that men of military age who join the Association will not be exempted from military service by the fact of their joining the Association.

The regulations, other than the age admission regulation, laid down in Government Circular 1919 will apply to all members of the Association admitted to its ranks under the amended age conditions laid down in this circular.

Men between the ages of 35 and 60 who are willing to join the Association should submit their names and addresses to the Chief Constable, together with particulars of any previous Police, Naval, Military, or Air Service they may have performed. They should state whether they desire to join the foot or mobile section.
