



Import Duties (Exemptions) (No. 1) (Isle of Man) Order, 1940.

His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor has made an Order (a copy of which is appended) under section one of the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1932, and subsection (2) of section five of the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1934, directing, inter alia, that the goods specified in the Schedule to such Order shall be added to the First Schedule to the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1932, and that the said Schedule as amended by the Import Duties (Exemptions Consolidation) (Isle of Man) Order, 1936, and by subsequent Orders shall be further amended.

C U S T O M S .

THE IMPORT DUTIES (EXEMPTIONS) (No. 1) (ISLE OF MAN) ORDER, 1940. (IRON AND STEEL GOODS)

WHEREAS the Treasury has by Order (No. 10) dated the 4th day of December, 1939, made under sections 1 and 19 of the Import Duties Act, 1932, section 10 of the Finance Act, 1934, and section 1 of the Import Duties (Emergency Provisions) Act, 1939, ordered that the goods specified in the Schedule to the Order be added to the First Schedule to the Import Duties Act, 1932, and that the said First Schedule, as amended by the Import Duties (Exemptions Consolidation) Order, 1935, and by subsequent Orders, shall be further amended, and that the Import Duties (General) Order, 1935, hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Treasury Order" shall also be further amended.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, the said Lieutenant Governor, by virtue of the powers conferred on me by section 1 of the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1932, and by sub-section (2) of section 5 of the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1934, and of all powers enabling me in that behalf, make the following Order:—

1. The goods specified in the Schedule to this Order shall be added to the First Schedule to the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1932 (in this Order referred to as "the Exemptions Schedule").
2. The Exemptions Schedule as amended by the Import Duties (Exemptions Consolidation) (Isle of Man) Order, 1936, and by subsequent Orders, shall be further amended by inserting therein, in lieu of paragraph (4) of Group VII, the words and figures contained in the Schedule to this Order, with the substitution for the

words " this Order," in each place where they occur, of references to the short title of this Order, and the omission of the words " not already included in the Exemptions Schedule " in each place where they occur, and the Second Annex to the Import Duties (Exemptions Consolidation) (Isle of Man) Order, 1936, as amended by subsequent Orders shall be further amended in like manner.

3. References in the Import Duties (General) (Isle of Man) Order, 1936, to the Schedule to the Principal Treasury Order shall be construed as references to that Schedule as amended by the Treasury Order (No. 10) of the 4th December, 1939.
4. (1) This Order may be cited as the Import Duties (Exemptions) (No. 1) (Isle of Man) Order, 1940.
(2) This Order shall come into operation on the 22nd day of January, 1940.

SCHEDULE.

(4) Iron and steel (including alloy steel), and articles of iron or steel (including alloy steel) of the following descriptions (but excluding articles which fall within any entry in the Schedule to the Principal Treasury Order, referred to in the Import Duties (General) (Isle of Man) Order, 1936, as in force immediately before the coming into operation of this Order, other than an entry deleted by the said Treasury Order (No. 10) of the 4th December, 1939):—

- (i) Pig iron not already included in the Exemptions Schedule.
- (ii) Ingots.
- (iii) Blooms, billets and slabs.
- (iv) Girders, beams, joists and pillars, whether fabricated or not.
- (v) Angles, shapes and sections, whether fabricated or not.
- (vi) Colliery arches and pit props.
- (vii) Bars and rods not already included in the Exemptions Schedule.
- (viii) Plates and sheets.
- (ix) Hoop and strip not already included in the Exemptions Schedule.
- (x) Railway and tramway rails.
- (xi) Wire (including barbed wire), and wire cable and rope.
- (xii) Upholstery and mattress wire springs.
- (xiii) Screws for wood, whether coated or plated or not.
