



**THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS (ISLE OF MAN) 1939.
THE DEFENCE (LIGHTING RESTRICTION) (No. 2) ORDER, 1940.**

**Compulsory use of approved mask on headlamps of road vehicles
and prohibition of screening headlamps by alternative methods.**

His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor has made an Order under the Defence Regulations (Isle of Man) 1939, a copy of which is appended, dealing with the screening of headlamps on road vehicles.

- (1) On and from the 1st February, 1940, headlamps on road vehicles can only be used if screened by the fitting of the approved A.R.P. headlamp mask.
- (2) The mask may be fitted to either headlamp.
- (3) All other methods of screening headlamps hitherto permitted, will be prohibited on and from the 1st February, 1940.
- (4) The Order does not apply to public service vehicles, which will be dealt with in a later Order.

Failure to comply with the terms of the Order renders a person liable to the penalties imposed by the Defence Regulations.

**The Defence Regulations (Isle of Man) 1939.
The Defence (Lighting Restriction) (No. 2) Order, 1940.**

I, the said Lieutenant Governor, by virtue of the powers vested in me by the Defence Regulations (Isle of Man), 1939, and all other powers in me residing, DO hereby order as follows :—

1. With the exception of headlamps on public service vehicles as defined in the Road Traffic Act, 1933, headlamps on mechanically propelled vehicles on roads may be used only if such headlamps are screened in accordance with the conditions contained in Articles 1 to 4 inclusive of the Defence (Lighting Restriction) (No. 3) Order, 1939, as amended by Article 1 of the Defence (Lighting Restriction) (No. 5) Order, 1939.
2. The use of the alternative methods of screening headlamps set forth in paragraph (3) of Article 5 of the Defence (Lighting Restriction) Order, 1939, and Article 1 of the Defence (Lighting Restriction) (No. 2) Order, 1939, on mechanically propelled vehicles on roads, except the public service vehicles specified in paragraph 1 hereof, is hereby prohibited.
3. This Order shall come into operation on the 1st day of February, 1940.
4. This Order may be cited as "The Defence (Lighting Restriction) (No. 2) Order, 1940."
