



THE TRADING WITH THE ENEMY ACT, 1939

APPLICATION TO THE ISLE OF MAN

The Lieutenant Governor desires to announce, for the information of those concerned, that His Majesty the King has, by Order in Council dated the 16th January, 1940, extended the provisions of the Trading with the Enemy Act, 1939, of the Imperial Parliament to the Isle of Man with the exceptions, adaptations and modifications specified in the Order. The Act imposes penalties for trading with the enemy and makes provision as respects the property of enemies and enemy subjects.

The Lieutenant Governor also wishes to announce that, under the provisions of the Trading with the Enemy Act, 1939, the Board of Trade has made Orders entitled:

- (1) "The Trading with the Enemy (Custodian) Order, 1939" which constitutes a Custodian of enemy property to receive money due to enemies and to preserve enemy property in contemplation of arrangements to be made at the conclusion of peace ;
- (2) "The Trading with the Enemy (Specified Persons) (Amendment) (No. 4) Order, 1939" specifying a number of persons, companies, trading concerns, &c., which are to be deemed to be enemies for the purposes of the Act.

Both of these Orders apply in the Isle of Man.
