



The Defence Regulations (Isle of Man), 1939.

**The Fat Sheep and Lambs (Regulation of Sale)
(Amendment) Order, 1940.**

His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor has, under the powers vested in him by the Defence Regulations (Isle of Man), 1939, made an Order dated the 2nd February, 1940, (a copy of which is appended) amending the Fat Sheep and Lambs (Regulation of Sale) Order, 1939.

The effect of the amendment is as follows :—

1. The prices of graded lambs and yearling sheep sold in the Insular Marts on a deadweight basis are increased as under :—

Lambs born in 1939

First Quality Grade— $1/0\frac{3}{4}$ d. per lb. dressed carcase weight
Second Quality Grade— $11\frac{3}{4}$ d. " " " " "

Yearling Sheep

First Quality Grade— $11\frac{1}{4}$ d. per lb. dressed carcase weight

2. The prices of fat lambs and yearling sheep sold privately are increased as under :—

Lambs born in 1939— $1/0\frac{3}{4}$ d. per lb. dressed carcase weight
Yearling sheep — $11\frac{1}{4}$ d. " " " " "

Any person selling or buying privately lambs or yearling sheep for slaughter at prices other than those specified above will be liable to prosecution for an infringement of the Fat Sheep and Lambs (Regulation of Sale) Order, 1939.

The Order comes into operation on the 2nd February, 1940.

**The Fat Sheep and Lambs (Regulation of Sale)
(Amendment) Order, 1940.**

I, the said Lieutenant Governor, by virtue of the powers vested in me by the Defence Regulations (Isle of Man), 1939, and all other powers me in that behalf enabling, DO HEREBY order as follows :

1. In Article 4 of the Fat Sheep and Lambs (Regulation of Sale) Order, 1939, there shall be substituted for the words and figures "10d. per lb. dressed carcase weight for first quality grade lambs, 9d. per lb. dressed carcase weight for second quality grade lambs, and 9d. per lb. dressed carcase weight for first quality grade yearling sheep" the words and figures "1/0 $\frac{3}{4}$ d. per lb. dressed carcase weight for first quality grade lambs born in 1939, 11 $\frac{3}{4}$ d. per lb. dressed carcase weight for second quality grade lambs born in 1939, and 11 $\frac{1}{4}$ d. per lb. dressed carcase weight for first quality grade yearling sheep".

In Article 5 of the aforesaid Order there shall be inserted immediately after the word "lambs" the words and figures "born in 1939" and there shall be substituted for the words and figures "10d. per lb." and "9d. per lb." the words and figures "1/0 $\frac{3}{4}$ d. per lb." and "11 $\frac{1}{4}$ d. per lb." respectively.

2. This Order may be cited as "The Fat Sheep and Lambs (Regulation of Sale) (Amendment) Order, 1940" and shall come into force on the second day of February, 1940.
