



## The Defence Regulations (Isle of Man) 1939.

### The Meat (Retail Prices) Order (No. 1), 1940.

His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor has, under the powers vested in him by the Defence Regulations (Isle of Man) 1939, made an Order, a copy of which is appended, fixing MAXIMUM prices (set out in the Order) for sale by retail of Butchers' Meat.

A Meat Retailer must exhibit clearly and in a conspicuous position inside his premises a list of the descriptions of meat offered for sale and the maximum prices thereof, and must clearly mark all cow and bull beef and mutton exposed for sale.

No alteration has been made in the maximum prices of flat rib and flank, brisket and neck of beef in bullock and heifer beef, whole legs of pork, cow and bull beef, mutton and most of the sundries, which remain the same as set out in the Schedule to the Meat (Retail Prices) Order (No. 2), 1939; but the Order fixes increased maximum prices for the more expensive cuts of bullock and heifer beef, lamb, pork (except for whole legs), and for liver.

Failure to comply with the terms of the Order renders a person liable to the penalties imposed by the Defence Regulations.

#### THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS (ISLE OF MAN) 1939

#### THE MEAT (RETAIL PRICES) ORDER (NO. 1), 1940.

I, the said Lieutenant Governor, acting in pursuance of the powers vested in me by the Defence Regulations (Isle of Man) 1939, and all other powers me in that behalf enabling, DO hereby Order as follows:—

1. No person shall sell or agree to sell or offer or expose for sale by retail or buy or agree to buy by retail any of the descriptions of meat mentioned in the first column of the Schedule appended to this Order, at prices exceeding the prices set out opposite such descriptions of meat respectively in the second column of the said Schedule.
2. Every person who sells by retail any of the descriptions of meat mentioned in the first column of the said Schedule shall keep posted inside his premises in a conspicuous position so as to be clearly visible to all customers throughout the whole time during which any of such descriptions of meat are being offered for sale, a notice stating in plain words and figures the maximum prices of such descriptions of meat as fixed by this Order.
3. Cow or bull beef or mutton exposed for sale by retail must be so marked as to be clearly visible to all customers throughout the whole time during which such meat is exposed for sale.
4. No person shall in connection with the sale or proposed sale by retail enter into any fictitious or artificial transaction or make or demand any unreasonable charge.
5. This Order shall not apply to sales of any of the said descriptions of meat served as part of a meal by a caterer in the ordinary course of his catering business.
6. "Meat" means fresh meat sold by a butcher or other purveyor of meat.  
"Sale by retail" means any sale other than a sale to a person buying for the purpose of resale but shall include any sale to a person for the purposes of a catering business carried on by him.  
"Catering business" means the business of or undertaking of an inn, public house, hotel, restaurant, railway buffet, coffee stall or any other place of refreshment open to the public, or of any club, boarding house, refreshment contractor or canteen, and the expression "Caterer" shall be construed accordingly.

7. The Meat (Retail Prices) Order (No. 2), 1939, is hereby revoked but without prejudice to anything done or suffered under such Order.
8. The Act for shortening the language of Acts of Tynwald passed in the year 1865 applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Tynwald.
9. This Order may be cited as "The Meat (Retail Prices) Order (No. 1), 1940."
10. This Order shall come into force on the 9th day of February, 1940.
