



Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1927.

His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor has made an order (a copy of which is appended) under Section 15 of the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1927, exempting from duty of Customs certain specified dutiable articles on importation into the Isle of Man for a period ending on the 31st December, 1940.

Order, dated the 9th day of February, 1940, made by His Excellency Vice-Admiral the Right Honourable the Earl Granville, C.B., D.S.O., Lieutenant Governor of the Isle of Man, under Section 15 of the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1927 (17 and 18 George V. Ch. 20).

WHEREAS Section 15 of the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1927 confers power on the Lieutenant Governor with reference to the duty imposed by section 13 of the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1926, to exempt from duty any article mentioned in the order, which is liable to duty under such section where he is satisfied (inter alia) that an order has been made by the Treasury, under sub-section (5) of Section 10 of the Finance Act, 1926 (an Act of the Imperial Parliament), exempting the article from the duty imposed by Section 1 of the Safeguarding of Industries Act, 1921, as amended by any subsequent enactment.

AND WHEREAS the Lieutenant Governor is satisfied as respects the articles specified in the Schedule to this Order it is inexpedient, having regard to the Order made by the Treasury under sub-section (5) of Section 10 of the Finance Act, 1926, as amended by sub-section (1) of Section 2 of the Import Duties (Emergency Provisions) Act, 1939, dated 24th day of January, 1940, that duty should be charged thereon under Section 13 of the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1926, for the period ending on the 31st day of December, 1940.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, the said Lieutenant Governor, in pursuance of the power conferred on me by the said Act, and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf DO HEREBY ORDER as follows:—

Such of the articles mentioned in the Schedule to this Order as are not entered under the Customs Acts before the 10th day of February, 1940, or which have not been removed from a bonded warehouse before that date, shall be exempt from the duty imposed by Section 13 of the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1926, for a period ending on the 31st day of December, 1940.

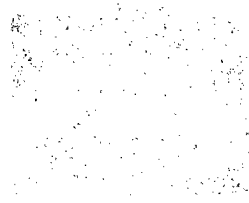

SCHEDULE.

Metallic residues which are dutiable only by reason of containing as a part or ingredient thereof either or both of the following compounds, namely:—

Sodium molybdate to an extent not exceeding 70 per cent, by weight of the material dried at 100° Centigrade.

Sodium vanadate to an extent not exceeding 20 per cent. by weight of the material dried at 100° Centigrade.
