



## The Defence Regulations (Isle of Man) 1939.

### THE FISH (PRICES) ORDER (No. 1), 1940.

His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor has, under the powers vested in him by the Defence Regulations (Isle of Man) 1939, made an Order, dated 16th February, 1940, a copy of which is appended, fixing the prices of all fish of the varieties specified in the Order :

- (1) landed in the Isle of Man, direct from the fishing boat;
- (2) to be charged to the consumer, whether such fish is landed direct from the fishing boat or is imported from the United Kingdom or elsewhere.

The fixed prices are set forth in the Order.

The Order comes into force on the 24th day of February, 1940.

Failure to comply with the terms of the Order renders a person liable to the penalties imposed by the Defence Regulations.

## THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS (ISLE OF MAN) 1939.

### THE FISH (PRICES) ORDER (No. 1), 1940.

I, the said Lieutenant Governor, acting in pursuance of the powers vested in me by the Defence Regulations (Isle of Man), 1939, and all other powers me in that behalf enabling Do Hereby Order as follows :—

1. On and after the 24th day of February, 1940, the prices to be paid for all fish of the varieties specified hereunder landed in the Isle of Man direct from the fishing boat shall be as under :—

2. On and after the 24th day of February, 1940, the maximum prices to be charged to consumers for all fish of the varieties specified hereunder shall be as under :—

Every person who sells by retail any of the varieties of fish specified in section 2 hereof shall keep posted in a conspicuous position so as to be clearly visible and legible to all customers throughout the whole time during which any of such fish is being sold or exposed for sale a notice stating in plain words and figures the prices at which he is selling or exposing for sale such fish.

4. No person shall in connection with the sale or proposed sale of any fish specified in this Order enter into any fictitious or artificial transaction or make or demand any unreasonable charge.

5. This Order revokes "The Fresh Fish (Prices) Order, 1939."

6. The Act for shortening the language of Acts of Tynwald passed in the year 1865 applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Tynwald.

7. This Order may be cited as "The Fish (Prices) Order (No. 1), 1940."
