



**THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS (ISLE OF MAN) 1939.
THE SUGAR RATIONING (No. 2) ORDER, 1940.**

His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor has made an Order, a copy of which is appended, entitled "The Sugar Rationing (No. 2) Order, 1940," requiring that on and after the 26th February, 1940, catering establishments and institutions will only be able to obtain sugar from retailers with whom they have registered for the purpose and to the amounts authorised from time to time in respect of each such establishment or institution.

The Order also provides that residents in or customers of catering establishments and institutions may only be supplied with such amounts of sugar as may from time to time be authorised.

Failure to comply with the terms of the Order, renders a person liable to the penalties imposed by the Defence Regulations.

**The Defence Regulations (Isle of Man) 1939.
The Sugar Rationing (No. 2) Order, 1940.**

I, the said Lieutenant Governor, by virtue of the powers vested in me by the Defence Regulations (Isle of Man), 1939, and all other powers me in that behalf enabling, DO hereby Order as follows:—

1. On and after the date when this Order comes into force the proprietor or person in control of a catering establishment or institution or any other person shall not obtain sugar for or on behalf of such catering establishment or institution except:—
 - (a) from the holder of a licence to trade under the Food (Rationing) Order, 1939, with whom such catering establishment or institution has been registered for the purpose.
 - (b) by means of a preliminary demand note or in accordance with any instructions which may from time to time be issued on my behalf.
2. The amount of sugar which the holder of a licence to trade may supply in respect of a catering establishment or institution shall not exceed such amount as may from time to time be authorised on my behalf in respect of such catering establishment or institution.
3. The proprietor or person in control of a catering establishment or institution shall supply to each bona fide resident in, or customer of such catering establishment or institution only such sugar and to such amounts as may be prescribed and in accordance with such instructions as may from time to time be issued on my behalf. He shall keep on the premises a register containing an accurate record of meals supplied and quantities of sugar obtained and used in such form and containing such particulars as may be prescribed from time to time on my behalf and shall produce such register together with all such invoices, vouchers and other documents as may be necessary or proper for checking the entries in the register to any person authorised by me or on my behalf.
4. This Order may be cited as "The Sugar Rationing (No. 2) Order, 1940," and shall be construed as one with the Sugar Rationing (No. 1) Order, 1940, and that Order and this Order may be together cited as "The Sugar Rationing Orders 1940."
5. This Order shall come into force on the 26th day of February, 1940.
