



The Defence Regulations (Isle of Man), 1939.

The Fat Pigs (Regulation of Sale) (No. 3 Amendment) Order, 1940.

His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor has, under the powers vested in him by the Defence Regulations (Isle of Man), 1939, made an Order dated the 16th March, 1940, (a copy of which is appended), amending the Fat Pigs (Regulation of Sale) Order, 1939.

The effect of the amendment is that, as from the 18th March, 1940, the slaughter of a pig (other than a swill-fed pig) of a live weight of eight score pounds or over will be allowed provided that the animal is slaughtered in an authorised slaughter-house.

ISLE OF MAN TO WIT.

I, the said Lieutenant Governor, by virtue of the powers vested in me by the Defence Regulations (Isle of Man), 1939, and all other powers me in that behalf enabling, DO HEREBY Order as follows:—

1. In Article 3 (ii) of the Fat Pigs (Regulation of Sale) Order, 1939, there shall be substituted for the word "nine" the word "eight".
2. This Order may be cited as "The Fat Pigs (Regulation of Sale) (No. 3 Amendment) Order, 1940" and shall come into force on the 18th day of March, 1940.
