**The Sucking Lambs (Regulation of Sale) Order, 1940**

His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor has, under the powers vested in him by the Defence Regulations (Isle of Man), 1939, made an Order dated the 16th March, 1940 (a copy of which is appended) fixing the price of sucking lambs sold during the period commencing on the 18th March and ending on the 30th April, 1940, at 1/4½d per lb. dressed carcase weight.

Sucking lambs purchased during the abovementioned period must be slaughtered within fourteen days from the date of purchase.

The Order does not apply to sucking lambs which are sold along with the ewes from which the lambs have been bred.

The Order also provides:—

1. In cases where sucking lambs are sold privately, both the seller and the purchaser must give notice in writing of the transaction to the Government Secretary, Government Office, Isle of Man, as required by the Fat Sheep and Lambs (Regulation of Sale) Order, 1939.
2. The sales of sucking lambs in the Insular Marts must be notified to the Government Secretary by the occupiers of the Marts.
3. Sucking lambs must only be slaughtered in authorised slaughterhouses and the occupiers thereof must furnish the Government Secretary with a weekly statement of all sucking lambs slaughtered.

**The Sucking Lambs (Regulation of Sale) Order, 1940.**

I, the said Lieutenant Governor, by virtue of the powers vested in me by the Defence Regulations (Isle of Man), 1939, and all other powers me in that behalf enabling, DO HEREBY Order as follows :—

1. Between the 18th day of March and the 30th day of April, 1940, no person shall sell or agree to sell or offer or expose for sale or buy or agree to buy sucking lambs at a price other than one shilling and fourpence halfpenny per pound dressed carcase weight, and any sucking lambs purchased during the aforesaid period shall be slaughtered within a period of fourteen days from the date of purchase.

The provisions of this Article shall not apply in the case of sucking lambs which are sold along with the ewes from which such lambs have been bred.

2. The cost of weighing the carcases of sucking lambs shall be paid for by the purchaser of the animals and the official weight tickets duly signed by the Superintendent or person in charge of the authorised slaughterhouse in which the animals are slaughtered shall be produced by the purchaser to the seller within seven days of the date of slaughter.
3. Articles 6 to 11 inclusive of the Fat Sheep and Lambs (Regulation of Sale) Order, 1939, shall apply to sucking lambs.
4. Infringements of this Order are offences against the Defence Regulations (Isle of Man), 1939.
5. This Order may be cited as "The Sucking Lambs (Regulation of Sale) Order, 1940."
