## **Import Duties (Exemptions) (No. 2) (Isle of Man) Order, 1940.**

His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor has made an Order (a copy of which is appended) under section one of the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1932, and subsection (2) of section five of the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1934, directing, inter alia, that the goods specified in the Schedule to such Order shall be added to the First Schedule to the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1932, and that the said Schedule as amended by the Import Duties (Exemptions Consolidation) (Isle of Man) Order, 1936, and by subsequent Orders shall be further amended.

### **C U S T O M S .**

#### **THE IMPORT DUTIES (EXEMPTIONS) (No. 2) (ISLE OF MAN) ORDER, 1940.**

#### **(IRON AND STEEL PRODUCTS).**

WHEREAS the Treasury has by Order (No. 1) dated the 14th day of March, 1940, made under sections 1 and 19 of the Import Duties Act, 1932, section 10 of the Finance Act, 1934, and section 1 of the Import Duties (Emergency Provisions) Act, 1939, ordered that the goods specified in the Schedule to the Order be added to the First Schedule to the Import Duties Act, 1932, and that the said First Schedule, as amended by the Import Duties (Exemptions Consolidation) Order, 1935, and by subsequent Orders, shall be further amended, and that the Import Duties (General) Order, 1935, hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Treasury Order" shall also be further amended.

NOW, THEREFORE, I the said Lieutenant Governor, by virtue of the powers conferred on me by section 1 of the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1932, and by sub-section (2) of section 5 of the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1934, and of all powers enabling me in that behalf, make the following Order:—

1. The goods specified in the Schedule to this Order shall be added to the First Schedule to the Isle of Man (Customs) Act, 1932.
2. The said First Schedule as amended by the Import Duties (Exemptions Consolidation) (Isle of Man) Order, 1936, and by subsequent Orders, shall be further amended as follows, that is to say:—
  - (a) after paragraph (4) of Group VII. there shall be inserted as a new paragraph (5) of that Group the words and figures contained in Part I of the Schedule to this Order;
  - (b) after the paragraph numbered (5) directed by the foregoing subparagraph to be inserted in Group VII. there shall be inserted as a new paragraph (6) of that Group the words contained in Part II. of the Schedule to this Order;
  - (c) paragraphs (5) to (18) of Group VII. shall be re-numbered as paragraphs (7) to (20) respectively;

and the Second Annex to the Import Duties (Exemptions Consolidation) (Isle of Man) Order, 1936, as amended by subsequent Orders shall be further amended in like manner.

3. References in the Import Duties (General) (Isle of Man) Order, 1936, to the Schedule to the Principal Treasury Order shall be construed as references to that Schedule as amended by Treasury Order (No. 1) of the 14th day of March, 1940.
4. (1) This Order may be cited as the Import Duties (Exemptions) (No. 2) (Isle of Man) Order, 1940.  
(2) This Order shall come into operation on the 28th day of March, 1940.

### SCHEDULE.

#### PART I.

Iron and steel products of the following descriptions:—

- (i) Railway and tramway construction material of the following descriptions:—

Sleepers, tie rods, tie bars, fish plates, sole plates and continuous joint plates.
- (ii) Bolts, whether threaded or not, bolt ends, set screws and screw studs, and other screws for metal, and nuts, whether tapped or not (including washers assembled with any of those articles).
- (iii) Coach screws.
- (iv) Rivets (other than bifurcated rivets manufactured from wire and tubular rivets with open ends) and washers.
- (v) Wire netting, wire fencing and wire mesh of all kinds (including woven wire).
- (vi) Nails (including hobnails and boot and shoe studs and spikes), tacks and staples (other than insulated staples).
- (vii) Jack chain (including mattress chain) and mattress hooks.

#### PART II.

Parts of railway and tramway rolling stock, being products of iron or steel, of the following descriptions:—

Wheels, tyres, axles and buffers.
