



The Defence Regulations (Isle of Man) 1939.
CLOSING OF SWITZERLAND ROAD,
DOUGLAS.

His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, has, under the powers vested in him by the Defence Regulations (Isle of Man), 1939, made an Order, a copy of which is appended, closing, as from the 1st April, 1940, Switzerland Road, Douglas, from the point where it enters Victoria Road to a point immediately above the back entrance of "Lucerne Villa."

On and after 1st April, 1940, no person may use the closed portion of the road except under the authority of the Officer Commanding H.M.S. "St. George."

Failure to comply with the terms of the Order renders a person liable to the penalties imposed by the Defence Regulations.

THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS (ISLE OF MAN), 1939.

REGULATION 16.

CLOSING OF SWITZERLAND ROAD, DOUGLAS.

BY VIRTUE of the powers in me vested by the Defence Regulations (Isle of Man), 1939, I, the said Lieutenant Governor, DO hereby order that the highway known as "Switzerland Road," Douglas, from the point where it enters Victoria Road, Douglas, to a point immediately above the back entrance of the residence known as "Lucerne Villa," shall be stopped up by means of fences with locked gates, and only such persons as may have the authority of the Officer Commanding H.M.S. "St. George" shall be permitted to pass along the closed portion of the said highway.

This Order shall come into operation on the 1st day of April, 1940.
