HIS EXCELLENCY THE LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR has issued a Proclamation (under the Bankers' Act, 1872), a copy of which is appended, appointing THURSDAY, the 13th JUNE, 1940, to be observed as a Bank Holiday in the Island, in place of Saturday, the 14th December, 1940.

ISLE OF MAN TO WIT.

### A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, by Section 5 of the Bankers' Act, 1872, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor by Proclamation from time to time, when it is made to appear to the Governor in any special case, that in any year it is inexpedient that a day by the said Act appointed for a Bank Holiday should be a Bank Holiday, to declare that such day shall not in such year be a Bank Holiday, and to appoint such other day as to the Governor may seem fit to be a Bank Holiday instead of such day, and thereupon the day so appointed by the Governor shall in such year be substituted for the day so appointed by the said Act.

AND WHEREAS the 14th December, 1940, is His Majesty's Birthday and is appointed to be observed as a Bank Holiday in this Island.

AND WHEREAS His Majesty has directed that His Birthday shall be celebrated in 1940 at all Stations both at Home and Abroad, on Thursday, the 13th June.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, the said Lieutenant Governor, by virtue of the power and authority in me vested as aforesaid, do hereby declare that the 14th day of December, 1940, shall not be a Bank Holiday, and I hereby appoint the 13th day of June, 1940, to be observed as a Bank Holiday throughout this Isle in the place of such 14th day of December, 1940.
