Additional Import Duties (No. 4) (Isle of Man) Order, 1940.

His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor has made an Order (a copy of which is appended) under Section two of the Isle of Man (Customs) (No. 2) Act, 1932, directing that references in the Import Duties (General) (Isle of Man) Order, 1936, to the schedule to the principal Treasury Order shall be construed as references to that schedule as amended by Treasury Order No. 4 of the 25th April, 1940.

CUSTOMS.

Additional Important Duties (No. 4) (Isle of Man) Order, 1940 (Strawberries.)

WHEREAS under the Import Duties (General) (Isle of Man) Order, 1936 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Order), it was ordered that there should on the removal or importation into this Isle of goods, of such classes and descriptions as were specified in a certain Treasury Order (therein referred to as the principal Treasury Order) be charged subject to and in accordance with the principal Treasury Order, such additional duties of Customs as were therein specified.

AND WHEREAS the principal Treasury Order has been amended by Treasury Order No. 4 of the 25th day of April, 1940.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by virtue of the powers conferred on me by Section 2 of the Isle of Man (Customs) (No. 2) Act, 1932, and of all powers enabling me in that behalf hereby make the following Order:—

1. As from the date of the making of this Order references in the principal Order to the schedule to the principal Treasury Order shall be construed as references to that Schedule as amended by the said Treasury Order No. 4 of the 25th day of April, 1940.
2. This Order may be cited as the Additional Import Duties (No. 4) (Isle of Man) Order, 1940.
