A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS by Section 5 of the Bankers' Act, 1872, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor by Proclamation from time to time, when it is made to appear to the Governor in any special case, that in any year it is inexpedient that a day by the said Act appointed for a Bank Holiday should be a Bank Holiday, to declare that such day shall not in such year be a Bank Holiday, and to appoint such other day as to the Governor may seem fit to be a Bank Holiday instead of such day, and thereupon the day so appointed by the Governor shall in such year be substituted for the day so appointed by the said Act

AND WHEREAS the 13th May, 1940, is appointed to be observed as a Bank Holiday in this Island, being the Monday in Whitsun Week

AND WHEREAS it is inexpedient that such day should be observed as a Bank Holiday

NOW, THEREFORE, I, the said Lieutenant Governor, by virtue of the power and authority in me vested as aforesaid, do hereby declare that the 13th day of May, 1940, shall not be a Bank Holiday, and I hereby appoint the 31st day of December, 1940, to be observed as a Bank Holiday throughout this Isle in the place of such 13th day of May, 1940.
