



The Defence Regulations (Isle of Man), 1939.

WOOL

The balance of the 1939 wool-clip for the Isle of Man in the ownership of farmers on the 21st May, 1940, is requisitioned by Article 3 of the Control of Wool (Isle of Man) (No. 1) Order 1940, and under that Article the Treasurer hereby issues the following direction as to delivery :—

“The wool must be delivered on or before the 15th June, 1940, to the Government Wool Depot, Drill Hall, Douglas, (Mondays to Saturdays between the hours of 10 a.m. and 12 noon and 2 p.m. and 4 p.m. excepting Thursdays, when the hours will be 10 a.m. to 12 noon) or to one of the following authorised collectors who are authorised to collect only from farmers from whom they bought wool last year, and to dispose of the wool collected only to the Treasurer :—

The maximum amounts payable for good, clean, light greasy farmers' ungraded clips delivered into depots, will be at the following rates in pence per lb (being the rates set out in the Schedule to the above-mentioned Order) :—

Best Pure Shropshire & Suffolk	11d.
Cross Shropshire Halfbreds or Manx Cheviots	10½d.
Best Pure Leicester or Lincolns	10½d.
Leicester and Scotch Cross	9½d.
Blackfaced Scotch Hill Clips	9¾d.
do. do. Pasture	9¼d.

Intermediate, inferior or heavy in grease or sand, the rate will be in proportion.

Payment will be made by the Treasurer of the Isle of Man to the Farmer or Collector as the case may be for wool delivered at the Government Depot immediately after inspection by the Government Valuer; payment will similarly be made by the Collectors in respect of wools received by them from farmers.

Local Mills must apply for supplies of wool as required to the Government Wool Depot, Drill Hall, Douglas, where sale prices can be obtained.
