



The Defence Regulations (Isle of Man), 1939.

The Feeding Stuffs (Maximum Prices) Order, 1940.

His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor has, under the powers vested in him by the Defence Regulations (Isle of Man), 1939, made an Order, a copy of which is appended, fixing the maximum prices to be charged for feeding stuffs in the Isle of Man. The Order cancels the Feeding Stuffs (Maximum Prices) Order, 1939.

Copies of the Feeding Stuffs (Maximum Prices) Order 1940, made by the Minister of Food on the 6th January, 1940, and referred to in His Excellency's Order, may be inspected at Government Office.

Failure to comply with the terms of the Order renders a person liable to the penalties imposed by the Defence Regulations.

ISLE OF MAN TO WIT.

BY HIS EXCELLENCY VICE-ADMIRAL THE RIGHT HONOURABLE THE EARL GRANVILLE, C.B., D.S.O., LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR OF THE SAID ISLE, &c., &c., &c.

The Defence Regulations (Isle of Man), 1939.

The Feeding Stuffs (Maximum Prices) Order, 1940.

I, the said Lieutenant Governor, acting in pursuance of the powers vested in me by the Defence Regulations (Isle of Man), 1939, and all other powers in that behalf enabling, DO HEREBY Order as follows:—

1. Subject to the variations set forth in paragraphs 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 hereof, the maximum prices of feeding stuffs imported into the Isle of Man shall be the same as those specified in the Feeding Stuffs (Maximum Prices) Order, 1940, made by the Minister of Food on the 6th January, 1940, or any Order amending such order (hereinafter referred to as "the Minister's Order")

2. The following paragraph shall be substituted for paragraphs (a) and (b) of article 10 and Parts A and C of the Second Schedule of the Minister's Order, and such article shall be read accordingly:

"In the case of a sale of any feeding stuffs of a weight of less than one ton, the following charge may be added to the appropriate price:

Feeding Stuffs (other than compound cake, compound meal or compound mixture)

| Weight | Charge |
|----------------------------------|-------------|
| 15 cwts. & under 20 cwts. | 5/- per ton |
| 5 cwts. & under 15 cwts. | 10/- " |
| Under 5 cwts. | 20/- " |

Compound cake, compound meal and compound mixture.

| Weight | Charge |
|----------------------------------|-------------|
| 10 cwts. & under 20 cwts. | 5/- per ton |
| 5 cwts. & under 10 cwts. | 10/- " |
| Under 5 cwts. | 20/- " " |

3. The following paragraph shall be substituted for article 12 of the Minister's Order:

"Where in the case of any feeding stuffs, a charge is incurred in transporting such feeding stuffs from the importer's warehouse or manufacturer's premises in Great Britain to the port of shipment, such charge may be added to the appropriate price".

4. The following additional maximum charges per ton shall be added to the appropriate price to cover the cost of conveyance of feeding stuffs from the port of shipment in Great Britain to the farm in the Isle of Man:

5. Article 11 of the Minister's Order shall not apply in the Isle of Man.
6. The following paragraph shall be substituted for article 15 of the Minister's Order :
"Where credit is given to a buyer of feeding stuffs (other than a buyer for the purposes of re-sale) the seller shall be allowed to charge an additional sum of five shillings per ton, provided that such sum shall not be payable where payment is made within a period of twenty-eight days from the date of delivery of the feeding stuffs".
7. (1) Every seller of any feeding stuffs shall furnish in respect thereof to a buyer written particulars of any additional charges permitted by the Minister's Order as varied by this Order.
(2) Every seller of any mixture referred to in Article 2 (1) (d) or (e) of the Minister's Order shall furnish in respect thereof to a buyer written particulars specifying the composition of the mixture, the price of each of the ingredients therein contained and any additional charges permitted by the Minister's Order as varied by this Order or shall in lieu of furnishing such particulars furnish to the buyer an auditor's certificate certifying that to the best of the auditor's knowledge and belief the price charged for the mixture is in accordance with the Minister's Order as varied by this Order.
8. No person shall in connection with the sale or disposition or proposed sale or disposition of any feeding stuffs enter or offer to enter into any fictitious or artificial transaction or make or demand any unreasonable charge.
9. Any person in the Isle of Man who sells any feeding stuffs shall keep posted inside his premises in a conspicuous position, so as to be clearly visible to all customers, the current prices of all feeding stuffs sold by such person and as fixed by Order.
10. "Appropriate price" shall have the same meaning as in the Minister's Order.
"Feeding stuffs" shall have the same meaning as "specified feeding stuffs" defined in the Minister's Order, and shall include in addition compound cake, compound meal and compound mixture as defined in the Minister's Order, but shall not include any concentrate as defined in such Order.
"Auditor" shall mean a professional accountant who is a chartered or incorporated accountant or a member of any other recognised society or association of accountants.
11. The Feeding Stuff (Maximum Prices) Order, 1939, is hereby revoked.
12. This Order may be cited as "The Feeding Stuff (Maximum Prices) Order, 1940." and shall come into force as and from the date hereof.
