

The Defence Regulations (Isle of Man) 1939.

The Sugar Rationing (No. 3) Order, 1940.

His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor has made an Order, a copy of which is appended, entitled "The Sugar Rationing (No. 3) Order, 1940" amending the Sugar Rationing (No. 1) Order, 1940, as follows :

1. The weekly ration of sugar will be reduced to Eight ounces per week per person.
2. The holders of Weekly Seamen's Ration Books will receive supplies of sugar under separate authority.

The Order will come into force on the 27th May, 1940.

Failure to comply with the terms of the Order renders a person liable to the penalties imposed by the Defence Regulations.

The Sugar Rationing (No. 3) Order, 1940.

I, the said Lieutenant Governor, by virtue of the powers vested in me by the Defence Regulations (Isle of Man) 1939, and all other powers me in that behalf enabling, DO hereby Order as follows :

1. In article 2 of the Sugar Rationing (No. 1) Order, 1940, the words "or a Weekly Seaman's Ration Book" are hereby repealed, and for the word "twelve" the word "eight" shall be substituted.
2. In article 3 of the said Order the words "or by the holder of a Weekly Seaman's Ration Book" shall be added at the end of the said article.
3. This Order shall come into force on the 27th day of May, 1940, and may be cited as "The Sugar Rationing (No. 3) Order, 1940."
