THE ALIENS RESTRICTION ACT, 1922.

THE PASSENGER TRAFFIC ORDER (No. 2) 1940

His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor has, under the powers conferred upon him by the Defence Regulations (Isle of Man) 1939 and the Aliens Restriction Act, 1922, made an Order, a copy of which is appended, entitled "The Passenger Traffic Order (No. 2) 1940."

As from the 24th May, 1940, any person desiring to leave the Isle of Man must produce, prior to embarkation by ship or aeroplane, his National Registration Identity Card to an Immigration Officer, or duly authorised Officer of Police.

In addition, a person who wishes to leave the Island to proceed to a destination other than direct to a destination in Great Britain must obtain and produce an Exit permit issued from Government Office under the provisions of the Passenger Traffic Order, 1940.

Further, an alien desiring to leave the Island must obtain and produce a permit issued from Government Office under the provisions of the Aliens Restriction Order, 1939.

Failure to comply with the terms of the Order renders a person liable to the penalties imposed by the Defence Regulations.

**The Defence Regulations (Isle of Man) 1939**

**The Aliens Restriction Act, 1922.**

**The Passenger Traffic Order (No. 2) 1940**

I, the said Lieutenant Governor, under the powers conferred upon me by the Defence Regulations (Isle of Man) 1939, and the Aliens Restriction Act, 1922, and all other powers in me vested DO hereby make the following Order :—

1. No person shall proceed from the Isle of Man to any destination outside the Isle of Man unless he is in possession of and produces at the ship or aeroplane to an Immigration Officer or duly appointed Officer of Police his National Registration Identity Card prior to embarkation.  
This requirement shall be in addition to the requirement of any other Statute or Order for the time being in force.
2. This Order will come into operation on the 24th day of May, 1940.
3. This Order may be cited as "The Passenger Traffic Order (No. 2) 1940."
