



## THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS (ISLE OF MAN) 1939

---

### CLOSING OF ROADS IN THE VILLAGE OF ONCHAN

---

His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor has, under the powers vested in him by the Defence Regulations (Isle of Man) 1939, made an Order, a copy of which is appended, stopping up certain highways and rights of way in the Village District of Onchan, being highways and rights of way through or adjoining land appropriated for use in His Majesty's service, such highways and rights of way being coloured pink on the plan annexed to the Order, and including all or part of the roads known as Royal Avenue West, Imperial Terrace, Belgravia Road (including Belgravia Terrace) and Royal Drive.

Failure to comply with the terms of the Order renders a person liable to the penalties imposed by the Defence Regulations.

#### CONTROL OF HIGHWAYS — ONCHAN VILLAGE

---

I, the said Lieutenant Governor, in exercise of the powers vested in me by the Defence Regulations (Isle of Man) 1939, hereby direct that the highways or rights of way coloured pink on the plan hereto annexed, passing through certain premises in the village district of Onchan, appropriated for use in His Majesty's service, or through land adjoining such premises, shall be forthwith stopped up, and DO HEREBY prohibit the exercise of any right of way, or the use of any such highways.

AND I DO HEREBY give authority to Bertram Edward Sargeaunt, Government Secretary, to take all such steps as appear to him to be necessary and expedient in connection with the stopping up of such highways or rights of way.
