



The Defence Regulations (Isle of Man) 1939.

Closing of Roads in the vicinity of Groudle.

His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor has, under the powers vested in him by the Defence Regulations (Isle of Man) 1939, made an order, a copy of which is appended, closing, as from the 1st June, 1940, portions of roads in the vicinity of Groudle referred to in the Order and delineated on the plan attached to the Order. The plan may be inspected on application to Government Office.

On and after 1st June, 1940, no person may use the closed portion of the roads specified except under authority.

Failure to comply with the terms of the Order renders a person liable to the penalties imposed by the Defence Regulations.

THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS (ISLE OF MAN) 1939. CONTROL OF HIGHWAYS—GROUDLE AND VICINITY.

I, the said Lieutenant Governor, in exercise of the powers in me vested under the Defence Regulations (Isle of Man) 1939, Do hereby direct that the highways or rights of way in the Village District of Onchan and the Parish of Lonan delineated and coloured Yellow on the plan hereto annexed between the point marked "A" at King Edward's Road and the point marked "B" near to the approach road to Baldroma Mooar Farmhouse, and from the point marked "A" to the point marked "C" near to the approach road to Ballavarane Farmhouse, and from the point marked "A" to the point marked "D" on the bank of the stream running into Groudle Creek, all such points being marked in red ink on the said plan, passing through certain premises appropriated for use in His Majesty's services or through land adjoining such premises shall be forthwith stopped up, and I Do hereby prohibit the exercise of any right of way or the use of any such highways.

And I do hereby give authority to the Commodore of H.M.S. St. George to take all such steps as appear to him to be necessary and expedient in connection with the stopping up of such highways or rights of way, permitting only such persons as may have his authority to exercise the right of way or use the highways referred to in this Order.

This Order shall come into operation on the 1st day of June, 1940.
