



INTERNMENT CAMPS.

Regulations for Stores.

1. In a camp where a Quartermaster is not appointed the Chief Storekeeper will be responsible for all stores.
2. The pay of the Chief Storekeeper will be £3/0/0 per week; but in a camp where a Quartermaster is not appointed the pay will be increased to £4/0/0 per week. Billets will be provided in addition.
3. All stores received must be checked immediately and the number or quantity of each article taken on charge in the books provided for that purpose.
4. The establishment of each house is painted on the entrance door and in no case must this establishment be exceeded without authority from Government Office.
5. The number of prisoners allotted to each bedroom is painted on the bedroom door and 2 blankets and 1 pillow per prisoner must be provided.
6. No furniture must be moved from one house to another.
7. Towels must be locked up in a cupboard in the house to which they belong and issued as required.
8. Storekeepers will work out the quantity of daily issue for each house according to the official dietary. Prisoners will draw rations in bulk from the stores daily.
9. On arrival of prisoners the Chief Storekeeper will arrange that each house has in the kitchen the day's rations.
10. Dietaries must be posted in each house.
11. Storekeepers must requisition Government Office for new supplies a fortnight before stocks are exhausted sending a further requisition a week before exhaustion if the stores have not been received.
12. Bread, milk, meat and green vegetables will be delivered to the stores daily.
