



# Isle of Man Internment Camps.

---

## PRISONERS' BANKING FACILITIES.

---

1. Each prisoner, on admission, will be required to deposit all his money in excess of five shillings at the Camp Bank.
2. The Chief Purser will be responsible to the Commandant for the custody of prisoners' funds.
3. No prisoner may retain in his possession a sum exceeding five shillings at any one time without the special permission, in writing, of the Commandant.
4. The Chief Purser shall give a receipt to each prisoner who deposits money with him, and will issue to the prisoner a drawing-out book.
5. Whenever the cash in the possession of the Chief Purser exceeds £100, he shall pay the surplus into an account in the name of the Camp Commandant at the Isle of Man Bank, Limited.
6. Should the Chief Purser require funds from the bank to meet current drawings, he will apply in writing to the Commandant for a cheque on the Commandant's account at the bank to replenish his cash up to £100.
