

## Isle of Man Internment Camps.

## PRISONERS' BANKING FACILITIES.

- 1. Each prisoner, on admission, will be required to deposit all his money in excess of five shillings at the Camp Bank.
- 2. The Chief Purser will be responsible to the Commandant for the custody of prisoners' funds.
- 3. No prisoner may retain in his possession a sum exceeding five shillings at any one time without the special permission, in writing, of the Commandant.
- 4. The Chief Purser shall give a receipt to each prisoner who deposits money with him, and will issue to the prisoner a drawing-out book.
- 5. Whenever the cash in the possession of the Chief Purser exceeds £100, he shall pay the surplus into an account in the name of the Camp Commandant at the Isle of Man Bank, Limited.
- 6. Should the Chief Purser require funds from the bank to meet current drawings, he will apply in writing to the Commandant for a cheque on the Commandant's account at the bank to replenish his cash up to £100.
