

**THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS (ISLE OF MAN),

**THE TIMBER (REGULATION OF EXPORTATION)
ORDER, 1940.**

His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor has made an Order, a copy of which is appended, providing that on and after the 27th May, 1940, no Timber (including Pit Props) shall be exported from the Isle of Man except under the authority of a licence issued on behalf of the Governor by the Government Secretary or other authorised officer.

Failure to comply with the terms of the Order renders a person liable to the penalties imposed by the Defence Regulations.

**THE TIMBER (REGULATION OF EXPORTATION) ORDER,
1940.**

I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting in pursuance of the powers vested in me by the Defence Regulations (Isle of Man), 1939, and all other powers me in that behalf enabling, DO hereby Order as follows:—

1. On and after the date when this Order comes into force, no Timber (including Pit Props) shall be exported from the Isle of Man except under the authority of a licence issued on my behalf by the Government Secretary or other duly authorised Officer and on such conditions and subject to such restrictions as may be specified in such licence.

2. Any officer of Police or Customs or any other person authorised by me in that behalf may seize and detain any timber which has been submitted for exportation from the Isle of Man in contravention of the terms of this Order.

3. This Order may be cited as "The Timber (Regulation of Exportation) Order, 1940," and shall come into force on the 27th day of May, 1940.
